- Private sales of firearms between Minnesota residents are not restricted by Minnesota law.
- Sales of firearms between residents of different states must go through an FFL holder.
- Minnesota does not require registration in any state, county, or municipality of your firearms.

According to the National Firearms Act (NFA) machine guns, sub machine guns, short barreled shotguns and short barreled rifles (under 18 inches), are required by Minnesota & Federal law to be registered **PRIOR** to the sale of the firearm.
